

## Non-Collectible Items

The City of Jackson does not pick up the following waste items...

- Wastes generated by a contractor, such as tree trimmings, general construction refuse, and old carpet. Contractors must haul these wastes to the landfill; residents should work this out with the contractor before a job starts.

- Shingles, bricks, concrete blocks, dirt, asphalt, gravel and similar items.

- Liquid, flammable and hazardous wastes. Residents can bring these items to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection events that are held twice a year.

## Your Garbage Bill

The charge for collecting your garbage twice a week is included on your monthly utility bill from the Jackson Energy Authority as a convenience to you.

The Energy Authority, however, is not responsible for garbage pickup. If you have questions about your garbage service, call the City's Health and Sanitation Department at 425-8545.

# Trash? Garbage? Leaves?

## Here are some do's and don'ts about trash and garbage pick-up in the City of Jackson

### Household Garbage

The City of Jackson contracts with Waste Management to pick up garbage twice a week from residents' homes.

- Please put your garbage in approved garbage receptacles (32 gallons or smaller) and in garbage bags. The garbage cans must not weigh more than 70 pounds when filled.

- The garbage cans must be either on the side or at the back of your house. They must not be in or on porches, patios, decks, garages or carports.

### Trash, Yard Waste and Bulky Items

Residents also are entitled to once-a-week curbside trash collection for items that are too large for garbage containers, such as limbs and boxes. Call 425-8545 to schedule a pickup.

- Items placed at the curb for pickup should be easily accessible from the street by personnel and/or machinery.

- Do not put items under low power, phone or cable lines; in the street or drainage ditches; around fire plugs, utility poles or utility support cables; or in any area that would impede the vision of pedestrians or motorists.

- Limbs should be in four-foot lengths.

- Leaves and grass clippings, loose paper products, packing materials, and clothes should be bagged and should not exceed the 70-pound limit.

- Used appliances will be collected at the curb. Any appliance containing Freon must have documentation on it from a certified service repairman that the Freon was removed.



### Loose Leaves

The City of Jackson Street Dept. picks up loose leaves from November 15 to March 15 each year. The leaves are collected on a route through the City that ensures each street gets equal service at least twice during the leaf season. After March 15, all leaves and pine needles must be bagged.

- Loose leaves and pine needles must be raked to the curb (not in the street) where the leaf vacuum can reach them.

- Leaves should be kept out of ditches, streets and other drainage systems.

Bagged leaves are collected by different personnel. Call the City Services Hotline at 425-CITY(2489) for pickup.
