***Jackson Man Found Guilty of Aggravated Robbery, Faces
Several other Charges***

On Tuesday in Madison County Circuit Court Division, I, a jury found Marquon Green, 22, guilty of aggravated robbery concerning the robbery of a student on the campus of Lane College. Green will remain in custody at the Madison County Jail pending sentencing on March 12. He faces eight to 12 years in prison.

An investigation by Jackson police concluded that around 11 a.m. on February 5, 2011 the woman was getting into her parked car when Green approached her with a handgun and demanded her purse. He then took the purse and ran away.

Green is scheduled to go to trial on May 1 on charges of aggravated kidnapping, aggravated rape and aggravated robbery for a separate attack on a different Lane student that occurred two days after the robbery. Around 11:20 a.m., the woman was sitting in her car on the parking lot of St. Paul C.M.E. Church on Middleton Street. Green suddenly got into her car, pulled out a handgun and demanded her purse. She then followed his directions as he made her drive and pull into a parking space at Madison Place Apartments at 112 Rhone Street. He then raped and robbed her of her cell phone and digital camera.

Green was arrested by Jackson police the next day. Officers found a handgun, crack cocaine and marijuana in his pocket. He still faces charges for the drugs and weapon. Green was not a Lane College student.
