From the workbench

- Oil-based paint
- Adhesives
- Paint thinner
- Paint stripper
- Starter fluid
- Wallpaper remover

From the garage

- Gasoline
- Antifreeze
- Coolants
- Fuel & oil additives
- Used oil
- Non-alkaline batteries
- Pool chemicals
- Aerosols
- Car wax & polishes

From the yard

- Herbicides
- Pesticides, fungicides
- Fertilizers
- Other lawn & garden products
- Wood preservatives

From the house

- Household, drain & oven cleaners
- Stove polish
- Disinfectants
- Computers & parts
- Medicines/drugs
- Fluorescent light bulbs

DO NOT BRING ...

Alkaline batteries; latex paint; medical waste; smoke detectors; empty containers; ammunition; fireworks; business, hospital & school waste; televisions & appliances

REMEMBER ...

- Put alkaline batteries in the regular trash.
- Dry small amounts of latex paint until solid and then put in the regular trash.
- Do not mix chemicals.
- Keep waste in original containers.
- Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generators (small businesses with less than 220 lbs. of hazardous waste a month) can participate **by appointment only**. Call 615.643.3170 for details.
