

MINUTES
CITY COUNCIL CALLED MEETING
MAY 15, 2014

The Jackson, Tennessee, City Council met in a special public session on Thursday, May 15, 2014, at 9:00 a.m. in the George A. Smith Meeting Room at City Hall with Mayor Jerry Gist and Councilmembers Charles “Pepper” Bray; Ernest Brooks II; David Cisco; Scott Conger; Johnny Dodd; Charles Rahm; and Randy Wallace present. Councilmembers Vicky Foote and Harvey Buchanan were not present. Also present was Anita Brooks, recorder of the minutes.

Mayor Gist gave the invocation and led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor Gist extended an invitation for public comment to anyone present who wished to express comments related to the business item on the meeting agenda and acknowledged the presence of Jackson-Madison School Board member David Clift in the audience.

City Attorney Lewis Cobb advised the City Council that the resolution to resolve the mixing bar tax issue adopted at the May 6, 2014, meeting gave the mayor the authority to negotiate an agreement with the Madison County Commission and the Jackson-Madison County School System, and the proposed resolution/agreement presented before the City Council at today’s meeting would give the mayor authorization to enter into an agreement to effectuate a settlement with Madison County and the Jackson-Madison County School System. On the motion of Councilmember Conger, seconded by Councilmember Brooks, unanimous

approval was given to adopt the resolution/agreement to resolve the mixing bar tax issue under TCA § 57-4-301 to pass 50% of the mixing bar tax to the Jackson/Madison County School System via the County Trustee.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
